: hex.-helper  
  hex u. ;
```

  base @ >r ['] hex.-helper catch r> base ! throw ;
```

: foo  
  ... hex. ...

```

How to write hex.

```
: hex.  
base @ { oldbase }  
TRY  
    hex foo \ now the hex is placed correctly  
    0      \ value for throw  
RESTORE  
    oldbase base !  
ENDTRY  
throw ;
```

```
: foo  
    ... hex. ...  
    ... .    ... ;
```

decimal foo

Get and Set?

GET-CURRENT SET-CURRENT

Has certain benefits, but not for context problem

Context wrapper

```
: hex.  
  ['] u. $10 base-execute ;
```

```
: foo  
  ... hex. ...  
  ... . ... ;
```

decimal foo

hex foo

Other contexts

outfile-execute

infile-execute

Other languages: Postscript

```
<< /base 16 >> begin ... end
```

Other languages: Lisp

Dynamically scoped variables

Other languages: Unix environment variables

```
env LANG=DE_at.utf-8 gforth
```
